Year 1478

Lyse Bernt ten Slyck

(form of Elisabeth) (Bernt = form of Bernard; ten Slyck was a propertry in the hamlet of

Brummen)

Heyle Johan Raven

(Germanic, meaning 'whole') (Raven, possible nickname for a person with black/dark hair OR son of

Walraven)

Lamberich Evert Bartholsz

(meaning 'lamb') (Bartholsz, son of Barthold/Bertold)

Griete Herman Hermans

(short for Margaretha) (son of Herman)

Engel Verwers Gijsbert

(Engel means angel, (meaning 'of noble birth')
Verwer is wool dyer)

Illegible Jan Kribbe

(possible nickname for someone who whines a lot, OR crib)

Nese Henrick Holterman

(medieval Dutch for 'pure') (Holt is old Dutch/dialect for wood, possible wood seller)

Griete Schoenwaen Henrick then Becker

(short for Margaretha, (dialect for baker, of stones or bread)

schoenwaen possible shoe seller)

Illegible Gerrit Addkinck

(the suffix -inck is a patronym, perhaps son of Addik, Frisian name)

Gertruyt Bernt Mengerinck (Gertrude) (Son of Menge/Mengel)

Illegible Goessen Evers

(Goessen comes from French Jossin, derivative of Joseph; son of Evert)



Hille Henrick Vysserinck

(form of Hilda) (Vysser could mean fisherman, -inck indicating a son of a fisherman)

Year 1480

(?) to Kalfzeler Bernt van Heeck

(Kalf is a calf, (Heek is a toponym, a town in Germany or in Limburg)

zeler or zele is dwelling)

Gertruit Jan van Kessel

(Gertrude) (Kessel is a toponym, could refer to a town in Belgium or Germany)

Illegible Henrick Kryger

(Kryger means soldier, warrior)

Lysbeth Goessen Pijll (form of Elisabeth) (Pijll means arrow)

Illegible Gerit des Lepperss

(Lepper means shoemaker or sailmaker)

Illegible Arnt Tripmecker

(Tripmecker, the maker of wooden pattens)
