Lamberich
(meaning 'lamb')

Evert Bartholsz
(Bartholsz, son of Barthold/Bertold)

Griete
(short for Margaretha)

Herman Hermans
(son of Herman)

Engel Verwers
(Engel means angel,
Verwer is wool dyer)

Gijsbert
(meaning 'of noble birth')

Jan Kribbe
(possible nickname for someone who whines a lot, OR crib)

Nese
(medieval Dutch for 'pure')

Henrick Holterman
(Holt is old Dutch/dialect for wood, possible wood seller)

Griete Schoenwaen
(short for Margaretha,
schoenwaen possible shoe seller)

Henrick then Becker
(dialect for baker, of stones or bread)

Gerrit Addkinck
(the suffix -inck is a patronym, perhaps son of Addik, Frisian name)

(Heek is a toponym, a town in Germany or in Limburg)
